SWANSEA DISTRICT.

KENFIG.

- 1.—KENFIG is a straggling Village, lying on the edge of the Sand Hills Situation of Village bordering the Eastern shore of the Bay of Swansea, about 15 miles from Neath, of Kenfig. and 24 from Swansea by the Turnpike Road which passes through Pyle. Kenfig is about 2 miles South of the Turnpike Road.
- 2.-Kenfig at present contributes to Cardiff, with Aberavon, Cowbridge, Present and pro-Llantrissent, Loughor, Neath and Swansea. By the late Bill it was to have been posed Franchise. contributory to Swansea, with Aberavon, Loughor and Neath, the whole District sending up one Member.

3.-The Parish of Kenfig is united with the Parish of Pyle, which is Parishes of Kenfig sometimes called Pyle in Kenfig, or Pyle and Kenfig; or these might be and Pyle. considered as two Hamlets of one Parish, being joined under one Vicarage, though they have separate Churches. The two, taken together, would form but a small Parish; both are entirely agricultural, no Manufactory or even Coal Working existing in either.

4.—The Borough of Kenfig is one of the most ancient in Wales, and has, Borough of Kenfig. I was informed, three Charters; the last is from Isabel Countess of Wiggorne (Worcester) and Glamorgan, confirming one granted by her father. It is dated at Cardiff, on the 1st day of May in the 1st of Henry 6th. It says nothing of the Boundary; but there is a Presentment of a Jury at a Court Leet held on the 11th of January 1660, in the 12th of Charles 2d, which sets out the Metes and Bounds as they are now perambulated. There are 230 Burgesses; of whom 57 reside within the Borough, and 8 in Pyle. The present Portreeve is an intelligent farmer.

5.—The last Perambulation took place about 6 years ago. No part of the Present Limits Boundary is doubtful or disputed. It includes the whole of the Parish of of Borough Kenfig or Lower Kenfig, the whole of the Hamlet of Higher Kenfig, and a small part of the Hamlet of Trissient. The last two are in the Parish of Margam, and separated from Lower Kenfig by a brook.

6.-Within the Borough Bounds there are 26 qualifying Houses, taken with Number of qualify-6.—Within the Borough Bounds there are 20 quantying 1100305, taken in the land, of which number, 2 would be above the value of £.10. without land: ing Houses in the Borough of Kenfig. of the 26, there are in Lower Kenfig 17, in Higher Kenfig 7, and in Trissient 2.

7.—The total number of Persons in Lower Kenfig is 276, in Higher Kenfig Population of the 189, and in Trissient within the Borough 20; total within the Borough, 485.

8.—The number of occupied Houses in the Parish of Lower Kenfig, was Number of Houses. 49 in 1821, and 58 in 1831.

The number of Houses in Higher Kenfig and Trissient are returned with

Margam Parish, in the Census of 1831.

9.—Pyle contains only 2 Houses assessed to the Inhabited House Duty, Qualifying Houses and 7 to the Poors' Rate, of the value of £. 10 and upwards; but these last and Population of are, I believe, farms standing at a rent of £.50. and would therefore have Votes Pyle. for the County. The Population of Pyle Parish, by the last Census, amounted to 475 persons.

10.—There can be no motive, I should conceive, for altering the present Circumstances to Limits of this Borough, unless it should be thought that the Parish and Village of Pyle should participate in the Franchise. This would certainly give Boundary. the Borough rather more weight amongst the Boroughs with which it is associated; but nothing can give it any community of interest with them, Kenfig being purely agricultural, whilst all the others are more or less commercial or manufacturing.

11.—I recommend, therefore, that the Boundary of the Borough of Kenfig Proposed Boundary. shall be that of the ancient Borough of Kenfig.
